Do you need FRFF help with your state Property Tax/Rent Rebate application? To qualify, applicants must earn to

Every year, state Rep. Marty Flynn's office helps hundreds of seniors and people with disabilities apply and receive rebates on their property taxes or rent. The deadline to apply is June 30, 2018. If you haven't applied before, here is what you need to know:



The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program is open to:

- Eligible seniors 65 or older;
- Widows and widowers 50 or older; and
- People with permanent disabilities 18 or older.

What to bring with you when applying at the office:

- Renters should bring a completed rent certificate signed by their landlord (blanks available from Rep. Flynn's office)
- Proof of income
- Homeowners should bring receipt of taxes paid in 2017

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To qualify, applicants must earn less than \$35,000 per year (for homeowners) or \$15,000 per year (for renters). Only HALF of Social Security or railroad retirement benefits count toward eligibility.

A law supported by Rep. Flynn ensures Pennsylvania veterans who receive a stateprovided stipend related to their service will not be shut out of this program if it puts them over the income limit. The law also ensures that federal Veterans Administration benefits do not push a veteran over the Property Tax/ Rent Rebate Program income limit.
