Honoring Joe Montgomery

I hosted a ceremony with Rep. Leanne Krueger and Sen. John Kane in September to dedicate a portion of Pennsylvania Route 352 that runs through both Edgmont and Middletown townships as the Chief Joseph J. Montgomery Jr. Memorial Highway.

With Chief Montgomery’s untimely passing in 2023, our community lost a tremendous EMS and fire professional – and his family grieves a loving father, son, brother, and uncle. Throughout his life, Joe served with Edgmont Twp. Fire Company, Rocky Run Fire Company, Middletown Fire Company, Delaware County Park Police, and Riddle EMS.

May this be a constant tribute to a man who made a big and lasting impact, and inspire others toward service.

Legislation homegrown in the 168th enacted or moving toward the Governor's desk!

Act 3 of 2025

Inspired by Newtown Township Board of Supervisors Chair Leonard Altieri and member Paul Sanfranceso, Act 3 brings policy concerning second-class townships in line with the rest of our municipalities and allows ordinances passed to be effective immediately. This helps our local governments be more efficient and keep bad actors from taking advantage of waiting periods. It was signed by Governor Shapiro on June 27 of this year.



Health System Protection Act (H.B. 1460)

Delaware County and communities across the commonwealth have experienced the devastation of hospital closures caused by private equity taking over and looting our health systems. Passed in the House and now sitting in the Senate, this legislation would give the Attorney General's office more oversight tools to vet for-profit and private equity buyers, so Pennsylvanians' care is never coming second to profit margins and shareholder dividends.



Morgan Rose's Law (H.B. 1442)

Named after Morgan Rose Hosbach, a young woman who passed from Sudden Unexpected Death in Epilepsy (SUDEP) in 2022. This legislation would require coroners to conduct a more detailed investigation to identify the precise cause of death in cases involving seizures, adding SUDEP as an option to be listed on a death certificate. It aims to raise awareness of the prevalence of SUDEP and contribute to research that could save lives. Passed in the House in June, the bill is now awaiting action in the Senate.



Pharmacy Prescription Transfer (H.B. 60)

I've heard from constituents with conditions such as ADHD, narcolepsy, and depression who have had to endure persistent shortages or disruptions to access their prescribed stimulant medications – a problem that increases the patient's risk of injury and overdose. To help alleviate disruptions, federal regulations were changed in August 2023 to give patients the ability to request their electronic prescription be transferred to another pharmacy without having to go back to their practitioner to initiate the request. This legislation would bring Pennsylvania in line with the updated federal regulations and is ready to be voted on in the Senate after being passed unanimously by the House in March.

Funding for projects in our community

- \$622,133 for **sidewalk improvements** to increase accessibility in Radnor around Stoneleigh Gardens and Villanova University.
- \$92,042 awarded to **local fire and EMS** from the Fire Company and EMS Grant Program.
- \$85,250 for **new sidewalks** along Bishop Hollow Road in Newtown Township.
- \$50,000 for Radnor A Better Chance to fund their **executive functioning program**.
- \$40,000 for boats to aid Radnor Fire's **water rescue operations**.

Town Hall with Congresswoman Scanlon

In April I gathered some incredible women to discuss the most pressing issues and concerns from the 150+ neighbors who turned out for our town hall in Radnor. It was standing room only for Congresswoman Mary Gay Scanlon, Senator Amanda Cappelletti, and Radnor Board of Commissioners President Maggy Myers, who joined me to answer questions and share thoughts on topics including SEPTA funding, protecting healthcare access across the county in the wake of the closing of Crozer Health, voting rights, project and program funding, and constitutional rights.

We are able to do our jobs best when we hear from the community about their concerns. Whether at a town hall or via a call or email to the district office, I want to hear from you!

REAL ID Seminars

My team partnered with PennDOT to host three REAL ID info sessions to demystify the process for our neighbors before the May enforcement deadline. We went over all the required documents, how to obtain them if you don't have them, and what to expect at the DMV.



Senior Events

Throughout the year, my staff organized events to serve the more than 13,000 seniors living in the district.

We partnered with law enforcement agencies for a Scam Jam to help seniors detect fraud.

At our Senior Health Fair, we brought in local organizations that provided free vaccines, Medicare expertise, and information on homecare and insurance. We also enjoyed an excellent lunch!

We also helped more than 175 residents over age 65 get a SEPTA Senior Pass at our events around the district, and brought in Franklin Mint Federal Credit Union and Anderson Elder Law for a seminar on how to include digital assets like online banking and social media in estate planning.

Door Knocking

My team and I regularly hit the streets to bring our services to your door! Be on the lookout for Alex, one of our new constituent service advisors, other staff and myself ready to help with state-related issues and community concerns. We also hand out information about our upcoming events.



Pet Clinic

We had the adorable pleasure of co-hosting a Pet Clinic with Sen. Tim Kearney's office and Providence Animal Hospital to keep our furry friends across Delaware County licensed, microchipped, and up-to-date on vaccines!



Shredding & E-cycling Events

Our free shredding events have helped thousands of constituents clean out their houses and keep their identities secure. We added electronics recycling to our spring event with Sen. Cappelletti in Radnor, and always have the District Attorney's office on hand to collect unused medications. It is wonderful to see so many old and new faces drive through!





License Plate Renewals

This summer we partnered with Radnor PD and Newtown PD to help residents replace their illegible license plates for free! Did you know you can face a \$100 ticket if law enforcement is unable to read your peeling or faded license plate? If you need a new plate before our next event, stop by our office to pick up the necessary forms, and staff can walk you through the process.
