# **Community Development & Public Interest**

# Local Share Account – Philadelphia (LSA – Philadelphia)

Funding Source: Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED)

<u>Who May Apply:</u> Community Development Corporations, Business Improvement Districts, Non-Profit Organizations with 501(c) designation.

<u>Use:</u> Economic development projects, neighborhood revitalization projects, community improvement projects, projects in the public interest. Any eligible project must be located in Philadelphia.

<u>Funds:</u> Varying based-on need, but minimum request/award of \$10,000 and a maximum request/award of \$500,000.

Application Deadline: January 31, 2024

# **Keystone Historic Preservation Planning Grant**

Funding Source: Pennsylvania Historical & Museum Commission (PHMC)

<u>Who May Apply:</u> Historic Preservation Organizations, Conservancies, Colleges & Universities, Religious Institutions, Museums, and other Historical Organizations. Historic property must be publicly accessible and listed in, or documents as eligible for listing in, the National Register of Historic Places.

<u>Use:</u> To support project that identify, preserve, promote and protect historic and archaeological resources of Pennsylvania for both the benefit of the public and the revitalization of communities.

**Funds:** Grant awards range from \$5,000 to \$100,000. A 50/50 cash match is required.

**Application Deadline:** March 1, 2024

### **Keystone Historic Preservation Construction Grant**

Funding Source: Pennsylvania Historical & Museum Commission (PHMC)

<u>Who May Apply:</u> Historic Preservation Organizations, Conservancies, Colleges & Universities, Religious Institutions, Museums, and other Historical Organizations. Historic property must be publicly accessible and listed in, or documents as eligible for listing in, the National Register of Historic Places.

<u>Use:</u> To support project that rehabilitate, resporte, or preserve historic resources listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

Funds: Grant awards range from \$5,000 to \$100,000. A 50/50 cash match is required.

**Application Deadline:** March 1, 2024

# **Alternative Fuel Vehicle Rebate Program**

**Funding Source:** Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP)

<u>Who May Apply:</u> PA residents whose total household income is below 400 percent of the Federal Income Poverty Level

<u>Use:</u> This program provides a rebate to Pennsylvanians who purchase or lease alternative fuel vehicles.

**Funds:** Rebates vary depending on the type of vehicle purchased.

Application Deadline: First Come, First Served; Rolling Basis\*\*

# **Arts Organizations & Arts Programs (AOAP)**

**Funding Source:** Pennsylvania Council on the Arts

Who May Apply: Community-Based Organizations, and Municipalities with at least two years of consistent arts

programming and an average arts revenue over \$200,000. School Districts are also eligible.

**Use:** Eligible use of funds include, but are not limited to, operating, programming or project expenditures.

Application Deadline: January 17, 2024

### **Empowered History Micro-Grant Program**

**Funding Source:** The Pennsylvania Historical & Museum Commission (PHMC)

<u>Who May Apply:</u> Any community group or member of a community with historical materials located in Pennsylvania. Highest priority is given to organizations with demonstrated financial need and historical material form communities that are underrepresented in the historical record.

<u>Use:</u> Enable communities to preserve and share their history through purchases that capture, preserve, or disseminate community history, such as (but not limited to) archival boxes, digital projects, educational materials, equipment to improve storage, and more.

**Application Deadline:** January 31, 2024

# **Entry to Arts Organizations & Arts Programs (AOAP Entry Level)**

**Funding Source:** Pennsylvania Council on the Arts

<u>Who May Apply:</u> Nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation, unit of government, or school district, providing arts programming and/or arts services in Pennsylvania with at least two years of consistent arts programming and an annual arts revenue of \$200,000.

<u>Use:</u> This program is the entry point for organization or program to enter the arts Organizations and Arts programs track. Eligible uses or funds include, but are not limited to, operating, programming or project expenditures.

**Application Deadline:** February 15, 2024

# **Education & Workforce Development**

# Manufacturing PA Training-to-Career Grant

Funding Source: Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED)

Who May Apply: Technical and trade schools, school districts, post-secondary academic institutions, workforce investment boards, economic development organizations, and nonprofit organizations. For-profit entities are not eligible. <u>Use:</u> Projects must focus on the development and deployment of workforce training programs for individuals with barriers to employment, engage youth or those with barriers in awareness building activities of manufacturing career opportunities, and advance capacity for local or regional manufacturers to meet the needs of local and regional manufacturers that cannot be met through existing programs such as WEDnet and Industry Partnerships.

Funds: Funds are available on an annual basis and vary based on recommendations and constraints set in the annual budget.

**Application Deadline:** Applications will be accepted and evaluated on an ongoing basis as long as funds remain available. More Information: https://dced.pa.gov/programs/manufacturing-pa-training-career-grant-program/

### **Health & Human Services**

# **Cooking in Healthy Electrified Commercial Kitchens Rebate**

**Funding Source:** Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection

Who May Apply: Pennsylvania based K-12 schools, higher education institutions, restaurants, non-profit hospitals, and nonprofits whose missions are geared toward community services such as soup kitchens, shelters, or food banks.

<u>Use:</u> Eligible equipment that is energy star certified and combustion-free (electric), demand control kitchen ventilation systems and induction ranges, cooktops, woks, griddles, and electrical infrastructure upgrades to accommodate additional electrical load.

Funds: Maximum Rebate of \$8,500 (total of \$150,000 Available)

Application Deadline: December 31, 2023

# **Violence Intervention & Prevention (VIP)/ Community Violence Intervention Strategies Projects (CCVI)**

**Funding Source:** Pennsylvania Commission on Crime & Delinquency

Who May Apply: Community-based organizations with 501(c)(3) designation, institutions of higher education, municipalities, district attorneys, and counties.

**Use:** Effective local intervening and preventative measures to stop gun violence that is occurring across the state.

**Funds:** \$40M in state funding available for two tracks:

- 1. VIP Grants: Applicants can receive up to 50% of their operating budget up to \$950,000.
- CCVI: Applicants can request up to \$3M in total funding over a 36-month period (FUNDING MATCH REQUIRED). 2-3 projects across the Commonwealth will be selected (HIGHLY COMPETATIVE)

Application Deadline: January 18, 2024

### **Grants for Local Businesses**

### Small Business Advantage Grant Program

<u>Funding Source:</u> Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP)

Who May Apply: Non-Profits with primary physical locations in PA, and 100 or fewer full-time employees. Commercial real estate businesses and tenant businesses may also be eligible if they meet the criteria outlined in the program guidelines.

<u>Use:</u> The Program is a first-come, first-served grant program that provides matching grants to assist small businesses undertaking energy efficiency, pollution prevention or natural resource conservation projects.

**Funds:** Between \$5,000 - \$8,000

Application Deadline: March 22, 2024 OR until funds are exhausted (Up to \$1M available)
