I DON'T CONSUME CANNABIS; HOW DOES THIS BILL BENEFIT ME?

The state will gain over half a billion dollars in new annual revenue to fund schools, healthcare, roads, public safety, and other critical services. Communities most harmed by past drug enforcement policies will finally get resources to create new opportunities. And nuisance vape and smoke shops would no longer be able to sell untested, unregulated products.



HOW DOES THIS BILL HELP KEEP IMPAIRED DRIVERS OFF THE ROAD AND CATCH THE ONES WHO ARE?

This plan would empower our well-trained and dedicated law enforcement officers to determine impairment from observation and educate the public about how aggressive the enforcement will be.



DRIVE FOR HOURS TO PURCHASE RECEATIONAL CANNABIS?

Not at all. Just as at today's Fine Wine & Good Spirits stores – nearly 600 locations across the state (more than McDonald's!) – our plan ensures that you'll have convenient, local access to retail cannabis. No long drives necessary, and rural communities will have a strong product selection too.



DOES THIS MEAN THE LIQUOR STORE WILL HAVE LESS SELECTION TO MAKE ROOM FOR CANNABIS?

No. In fact, cannabis sales will often lead to new or expanded PLBC stores. You'll continue to see a full range of liquor options, **and shelf space will still reflect what consumers actually want.**



WILL THIS FLOOD OUR NEIGHBORHOODS WITH CANNABIS STORES?

No. Unlike other states, we'll control the number and location of stores from day one.

The Liquor Control Board will control the number and location of dispensaries to ensure that every community gets access without over-saturating neighborhoods.



WHAT WOULD I NEED TO DO TO GET THE MARIJUANA POSSESSION CONVICTION OFF MY RECORD?

Nothing at all. Under this plan, low-level cannabis convictions will be automatically vacated, and your criminal record will be expunged within 60 days of the bill's enactment. No paperwork or action is required from you.



WILL I STILL BE ABLE TO ACCESS HIGH THC CANNABIS TO TREAT MY MEDICAL DIAGNOSIS?

Yes. Medical cannabis is exempt from the THC limits placed on recreational products. Your medical card will remain valid, and medical dispensaries will continue to operate just as they do today.



HOW MUCH CANNABIS CAN I LEGALLY POSSESS?

The law will allow possession of up to 1.5 ounces of cannabis flower, 5 grams of cannabis concentrates, or 500 milligrams of THC in other cannabis products.



CAN I GROW CANNABIS AT HOME?

Yes. You'll be able to apply for a permit to grow up to two mature plants and two immature plants for personal use at home.
