Affordable Care Act/Medical Expansion Repeal Pittsburgh | March 29, 2017

State Rep. Dan Frankel's House Democratic Policy Hearing focused on how to prepare for changes or a potential repeal of the Affordable Care Act and Medicaid Expansion.

Key facts from the hearing:

- More than 1,100,000 Pennsylvanians have access to health care coverage as a result of Medicaid Expansion and the Affordable Care Act.
- Hospitals in Pennsylvania received \$5 billion payments that accounted for 13 percent of their total revenues.
- Pennsylvania added 15,500 jobs in 2015 alone as a result of the Affordable Care Act.
- Repeal would put vaccination programs, infectious disease prevention, and breast and cervical cancer screenings at risk of being defunded.
