Pennsylvania offers a free health insurance counseling program (APPRISE) designed to help older Pennsylvanians with Medicare. Counselors are specially trained staff and volunteers who can answer your questions about Medicare and provide you with objective, easy-to-understand information about Medicare, Medicare Supplemental Insurance, Medicaid, and Long-Term Care Insurance. Property Tax/ Rent Rebate

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program benefits Pennsylvanians 65 and older, widows and widowers age 50 and older, and people with disabilities 18 older. Income limits apply. The maximum standard rebate is \$650 but supplemental rebates can boost that amount to \$975. Visit my office to fill out the necessary applications or for any questions about the program.

My office is now offering free notary services for state related documents. Please call us if you have questions about what documents can be notarized in the office. We are pleased to be able to offer you this service!






SEPTA Key Card Information

Skip the line and visit my office for your FREE SEPTA Key Senior ID Card.

Seniors 65 and older are eligible to travel for free on all SEPTA services lines within PA. My district office can process applications and take photos for the SEPTA Key Senior ID Card. Applicants must present a form of valid ID with a date of birth on it, such as a Pennsylvania driver's license or non-driver ID, U.S. Passport, or birth certificate.

Seniors must obtain a SEPTA Key Senior ID Card to ride for free – paper reduced transit fare cards and Medicare cards are no longer accepted. However, Valid PA driver's licenses issued before July 2017 will be accepted until they need be renewed.

REAL IDs in Pennsylvania

Beginning October 1, 2020, a REAL ID-compliant license or ID card, or a U.S. Passport or Military ID, will be necessary to board a domestic flight or enter a federal facility. A REAL ID license has enhanced security features required by federal law. REAL IDs are now available from PennDOT.

My district office can help obtain a certified copy of a Pennsylvania birth certificate. Sending an application through my office is the fastest way to apply for a birth certificate.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

I want to provide you with updates on legislation that I'm working on in Harrisburg.

Restore Pennsylvania: I'm proud to support Governor Wolf's major new infrastructure initiative. It will be funded by a long overdue, commonsense severance tax on natural gas drilling, and will invest \$4.5 billion over the next four years in significant, high-impact projects throughout the commonwealth to help catapult Pennsylvania ahead of every state in the country in terms of technology, development, and infrastructure.

Electronic Recycling: Everyone is excited to get the latest cell phone or flat-screen TV, but we don't often think about how our old electronics are filling our landfills with dangerous chemicals and metals. I am introducing legislation that will make it easier to recycle our electronics and reduce the toxicity in our waste stream. It's part of a package of bills called "Zero Waste PA" that my colleagues and I are working on to address waste, litter, and the various environmental harms caused by a "throwaway" society.

Justice for Crime Victims: Court-ordered restitution helps a crime victim regain any financial losses they suffered due to the crime and work towards a sense of closure. I am introducing legislation that will eliminate gaps in the law that negatively affect crime victims' likelihood of receiving the restitution owed to them.

Banning "Ghost Gun" Parts: I'm introducing legislation that would close the loopholes that allow the purchase, sale, and production of untraceable gun parts. Nearly 20% of guns used by mass shooters and 40-60% of those used in other crimes are illegally acquired. Firearms such as the AR-15 can be made using parts that do not require a background check or the paperwork to identify the purchaser or

firearm. These ghost guns need to be kept out the hands of the wrong people.

Ending Illegal Handgun Trafficking: Every year, hundreds of thousands of guns are trafficked throughout the country by way of the Iron Pipeline, a system of states with weak gun laws that allow people to amass enough guns through straw purchases. I've introduced legislation that will make it much more difficult for handgun traffickers to make straw purchases in Pennsylvania.
