I've had countless heartbreaking conversations with friends denied timely unemployment benefits despite their lack of employment. I've tried to remove emotion from my decision-making process, but that has proven difficult.

It is not an exaggeration to say some of these votes have a life-threatening or life-sustaining impact. There is no other way to say it; it has been burdening. These votes have been challenging and stressful.

Please know I have not taken any of these decisions lightly. I understand the worst-case scenarios and certainly do not want to do anything to contribute to that. I am doing the best I can and will always try to make the best decisions, hoping they will prove to be correct. In service.

Unemployment Compensation Problems

There is no question the PA Department of Labor and Industry was not prepared to handle the influx of applications amid the COVID-19 pandemic. While the department has issued more than 7 million checks so far to workers who lost their jobs or were furloughed, many residents have gone without receiving a single dollar.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, my staff and I have helped hundreds of people who reached out to our office after their calls to UC call centers went unanswered. This has been an extremely difficult and stressful time for so many of you, and it has been made even more difficult without having an easy way to contact an unemployment compensation officer.



A Pandemic Is Not the Time for a Rate Hike

This month, the Public Utility Commission began a series of virtual hearings to discuss PA American Water's proposed \$138.6 million rate hike request. With many families and businesses facing extreme financial hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic, now is certainly not the time for the PUC to approve any PA American Water rate change, which will result in Pennsylvanians having to choose between life's necessities.

I understand the challenges faced by our utility providers. I commend PA American Water and others who have taken extraordinary steps to protect our fellow Pennsylvanians during this difficult time. That said, I cannot sit idly by and silent as they seek to increase rates upon our citizens and struggling commercial and industrial neighbors.

I have sent a letter to the PUC asking them to consider everything Pennsylvania homes and businesses are enduring in these uncertain times and respectfully request that they deny PA American Water's rate hike request.

Mullery secures state funds for local water improvement projects

H20 PA Program:

\$508,833 for Rice Township to make repairs to the Ice Lakes Dam.

PA Small Water and Sewer Program:

- \$78,341 for White Haven Borough to make improvements to the storm sewer system along Pine and Berwick Streets.
- \$391,000 for Hazle Township for the Hollywood Area Sewer Rehabilitation and Replacement project.

"The residents and officials of Rice Township have faced numerous challenges and setbacks over the past five years to get the Ice Lakes Dam repaired. To be able to secure state funds, which will fully cover the cost of the repairs, will end this nightmare and return the beauty and tranquility of the Ice Lakes for residents and visitors to enjoy."

Fighting Blight in Newport Township

Blighted properties are a nuisance for both residents and visitors to communities. This past December, I was able to secure \$60,000 in grant funding for a blight removal project in Newport Township's Glen Lyon section.

Township officials had been working to acquire the 125-131 East Main Street properties for a long time, and a partial collapse of the largest property on the lot required requests for emergency funding.

Removing blighted properties is not a quick or easy process. There is a great deal of work that goes on behind the scenes to acquire the property and remove the blighted structures and improve our community. This could not be accomplished without the help of our township officials and local partners.



Rose Tucker Adult Center Improvements



In July, I was pleased to assist the Rose Tucker Active Adult Center in Nanticoke in receiving \$14,191 in state funding.

Many wonderful activities are provided at the Rose Tucker Center and it's great to see them receive funding from the state to continue helping older residents in the Nanticoke area.

It is especially important, now amid the COVID-19 pandemic, that our senior residents are able to have active, healthy and productive lives.

The funds are from the Pennsylvania Department of Aging's 2019-20 Senior Community Center grants – totaling \$2 million statewide.

Nanticoke Softball Team State Title Tenth Anniversary

Then in the 11th, with the potential game-winning runner on second base, sophomore Maggie Gola rose to the occasion, striking a whopping 2-run double and the Trojanettes took home the state championship.
