INVESTING IN EDUCATION

This year's budget is historic, to say the least. I proudly voted for the most significant increases in education funding ever seen in Pennsylvania. Basic Education funding gets a \$750 million increase, of which \$525 million will be distributed through the Fair Funding Formula. This is a major step forward in ensuring the next generation gets the education they need and deserve.

Other investments in our schools include:

- \$100 million increase in Special Education funding
- \$60 million in Pre-K
- \$19 million in Head Start programs
- \$225 million in Level Up funding

PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE

The burdens of inflation and corporate greed have affected many Pennsylvanians this year. I have been working with colleagues and the governor to expand the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program to put money back in the pockets of taxpayers on fixed incomes.

Our efforts paid off - recipients will get an extra payment equal to 70% of their regular payment, which will be

paid out of ARPA funds. Those already receiving rebates do not need to file an additional application. The Department of Revenue will add the supplemental amount and distribute it with the regular payment.

The deadline for the 2021 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program is December 31, 2022. Pennsylvanians living with a disability, widows and widowers 50 or older, and residents 65 or older

can qualify. The program has income limits for homeowners under \$35,000 annually or renters earning under \$15,000 annually (excluding half of Social Security income).

If you live in the North Penn School District and get the rebate, you're also eligible to apply for an extra rebate direct from the school district. Contact my office for more details.

FUNDING IN OUR DISTRICT

I am always working to bring investments back to our communities through state funding programs. Projects funded recently include:

- \$2.5 million to the North Penn YMCA for a full-size gymnasium that will host programs for seniors, young adults, and at-risk youth.
- \$2 million to Souderton Mennonite Homes for a major 38,500-square-foot construction project, including fully private rooms, new elevators, emergency generator, HVAC, and more.
- \$194,218 to the Susie Clemens House at Advanced Living's Derstine Run community in Hatfield, to support affordable housing for seniors.
- \$200,000 to Habitat for Humanity Montgomery and Delaware County to complete four homes on Cowpath Road in Hatfield.
- \$100,000 to Indian Creek Foundation to support neighbors with special needs who live in Montgomery County.
- \$354,240 to Hatfield Township to upgrade the traffic signal at Route 309 and Unionville Pike.

On The Trail



The Liberty Bell Trail, one of the most significant multi-use trails in the region, was awarded \$1.8 million in federal grant dollars.

- The borough of Lansdale received \$973,000 in funding, including \$600,000 to create a 10-foot wide shared-use trail and stream crossing that starts near the Ninth Street and Moyers Road intersection and runs north to Tremont Drive.
- Hatfield Township has been approved for \$910,000 in funding for a 10-foot wide shared-use path for about 1,500 feet along the PPL right-of-way extending from Orvilla Road. A sidewalk will be added to link connections with existing sidewalks at Schwab Road and Tarrington Way, and a rail line crossing will be added along Orvilla Road.
