Highlights from the **Finalized** State **Budget**



I'm proud to share that not only did we pass a comprehensive and bipartisan budget this summer, but two of my legislative initiatives were folded into the budget plan.

This budget invests historic funding in education - a \$1.3 billion increase - that helps every kid in every school and begins to meet our moral, constitutional, and legal obligation to our kids, schools, parents and taxpayers - and it does so without a tax increase.

Locally, this means that our schools have a \$5 million increase that will help them continue to provide the high-quality education that each of our children deserves.

I'm also proud to report that my legislation allowing employer contributions for PA 529 accounts, as well and my plan to reform the law regarding net operating losses (NOL) each passed in the budget deal.

The PA 529 bill provides a new creative solution to help families afford a college education for their students, and for the commonwealth to invest in our workforce. Looping employers into the tuition savings process will help facilitate

The NOL reform changes the tax deduction from 40% to 80%, which aligns with the federal standard to make PA-based businesses more competitive. The goal of the legislation is to ensure that PA is an attractive place to start and grow a business.

The budget also provides new funding for housing assistance, support for individuals with disabilities, public safety, and makes a number of other critical investments in our commonwealth.

I believe the plan reflects the priorities shared by the people of Pennsylvania and demonstrates our ability to lead and work together despite a divided government to deliver for Pennsylvanians.

Summertime means road repairs and improvements – and a highlight this summer was the work done on Saint Peters Road in Warwick and North Coventry townships. Over 5 miles of road was milled and repaved, providing a safer and smoother ride for all those who travel that stretch.

Additionally, you may remember that we secured the necessary funding to rebuild the collapsing portion of Saint Peters Road right outside Saint Peters Village. This project is currently in the preliminary engineering and design phase. We are in frequent contact with PennDOT to check in on progress and we will continue sending out periodic updates via our social media and e-newsletters.
