I'm proud to have joined Gov. Josh Shapiro, Secretary of Education Dr. Khalid N. Mumin, students and teachers during a visit to Amanda E. Stout Elementary School in Reading.



We highligted historic Investments in K-12 Public Education secured in the 2024-25 state budget and the creation of a new adequacy formula to drive more funding to support public schools in need.



#### THIRD ANNUAL BACK TO SCHOOL RESOURCE FAIR

It has been an honor and privilege to put together this Back-to-School Resource Fair for the third year in a row. This is a community-wide event, where Reading families were able to get backpacks, pencils, notebooks and even haircuts to prepare them for the upcoming school year.



#### FIGHTING HOUSING INSECURITY

I continue to champion efforts to address housing insecurity and advocate for the necessary funding and resources for our city.

I am glad to share that this year, the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) awarded the Reading Housing Authority (RHA) a Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency (ROSS) Service Coordinator grant totaling \$257,317. HUD also presented \$990,057 in funding to the Berks Coalition to End Homelessness Inc. via the Youth Homelessness System Improvement (YHSI) grant.



#### **RALLY FOR EQUITY IN PUBLIC EDUCATION**

In June, I had the pleasure to team up with state Reps. Ismail Smith-Wade-El and Justin Fleming in Millersville, Lancaster County, to emphasize the

critical relevance of H.B. 2370. This groundbreaking legislation would ensure fairness in the way that public schools across the state are funded.



#### **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

This year, I moved one step closer to removing barriers for Pennsylvanians who want to become real estate appraiser supervisors. My legislation, H.B. 2220, passed the House and was sent to the state Senate. It would allow people in the industry to "skill up" more easily as their career progresses.



## **SECURING RESOURCES AND FUNDING FOR OUR SENIOR POPULATION**

Earlier this year, I joined Jason Kavulich, secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Aging, state Sen. Judy Schwank, Berks community leaders and the Berks County Area Agency on Aging to welcome new grant funding for senior centers. Forty-five Senior Community Centers from 26 counties across the Commonwealth will receive one of the department's 2023-24 competitive grants totaling \$2 million. This significant investment will certainly enrich the lives of our senior population.



## **HEROES WITHOUT A CAPE**

I was immensely honored to welcome former U.S. Capitol Police Sgt. Aquilino Gonell and Officer Harry Dunn to the PA House as they were recognized for their exemplary service, courage and act of kindness toward others. Gonell and Dunn helped protect the U.S. Capitol from rioters during the Jan. 6, 2021 insurrection.





#### STRENGTHENING OUR LOCAL ECONOMY

I welcomed Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development Secretary Rick Siger to Reading in April. The visit underscored the pivotal role of the Main Street Matters program in fortifying our local economy.

The Main Street Matters Program will build upon the current Keystone Communities Grant Program, which is a proven, positive initiative that has significantly impacted our community.



#### **IMPROVING JOB OPPORTUNITIES**

Heartfelt thanks to all the residents who attended my job fair in Reading last May. The event, held in collaboration with the Reading Housing Authority, offered people the opportunity to network, explore employment opportunities and score a job as part of a simplified process.

More than 40 employers participated in the fair.



## A MAJOR STEP TOWARD ECONOMIC GROWTH

On October 16, the City of Reading announced the submission of its City Revitalization & Improvement Zone (CRIZ) application. I'm advocating for a CRIZ designation for Reading not just as a state representative but as a champion for the hopes and dreams of our community.
