

GOVERNOR SIGNS BILL

My legislation, The Uniform Family Arbitration Act, has been ceremonially signed into law by Gov. Josh Shapiro. Family court disputes are often costly and painful, and this new law will provide families with another option to resolve legal disputes fairly. The passage of this bill is the result of five years of hard work and dedication from a persistent bipartisan coalition. This is a significant victory for PA families and our burdened state court system.

HARRISBURG UPDATE

ADVANCING CHILDCARE

We recently heard from Gov. Shapiro as he delivered his budget address. I am excited to learn that he wishes to invest more than \$50 million to help child care centers hire and retain teachers. Multiple studies and surveys confirm that our early education teachers are paid significantly below the national average.

While recent state budgets have included funding increases for early childhood education, these increases are not sufficient to address the wage growth needed to recruit and retain staff who meet the childcare needs of working families and the educational needs of our youngest children. To tackle this issue, I have proposed a package of bills that aims to provide additional fair funding for PreK-4th grade educators. Increasing the wages of childcare professionals cannot be achieved by simply raising the costs that families pay. To resolve this crisis, our Commonwealth must offer more solutions to support working families and expand our workforce.

ANIMAL PROTECTION CAUCUS LAUNCH



The Animal Protection Caucus is back and ready to fight for our furry, feathery, and scaly friends! We had some great wins last year like improving our dog law, advancing bills to end pigeon shoots, and ensuring protections for pets of domestic violence survivors.

Now our priorities include giving law enforcement and humane society police more power to protect animals and re-introducing the beagle bill to stop inhumane testing on beagles in Pennsylvania! Thanks to the Humane Society of PA for their support! We have a great bi-partisan team who are ready to fight for the rights of animals!







REPRODUCTIVE ROUNDTABLE AND CODIFYING EMTALA

Since the Dobbs decision, access to safe reproductive health care in our country has been in chaos. However, Pennsylvania is making it clear that we will continue to protect women's rights. I joined officials from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Gov. Shapiro's office, Planned Parenthood, Access Matters, and my colleagues in the House to discuss the urgent state of reproductive health care in Pennsylvania. One action we discussed was my legislation to codify Emergency Abortion Care Protections. The Emergency Medical Treatment and Active Labor Act (EMTALA) was specifically passed in response to the inappropriate inter-hospital transfer of patients in need of emergency care due to their lack of financial resources, including those in active labor. To protect access to emergency health care for pregnant patients, states must codify




the same protections as EMTALA and specify that such protections include abortion and other reproductive health care.

COST-OF-LIVING INCREASE FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYEES

Public employees, such as firefighters, police officers, teachers, and municipal administrators, play a vital role in keeping our neighborhoods safe, educating our children, and ensuring that all residents have access to essential resources. They significantly enhance our quality of life, and it's time we take action to improve theirs.

Over 70,000 retired public employees in Pennsylvania live on fixed pensions and have not received a cost-of-living increase in over 20 years. I voted in favor of this cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) to help pensions keep pace with inflation.



COVERING FIRST RESPONDERS' PTSI

Emergency responders put their lives on the line to protect our families, but their critical and life-saving roles often take a severe mental and physical toll. That's why I voted to extend Workers' Compensation coverage to emergency responders who are suffering from post-traumatic stress injuries (PTSI).



EXPANDED OVERSIGHT FOR JUVENILE JUSTICE FACILITIES

The House Children & Youth Committee voted in favor of my bill, which would expand oversight and accountability of juvenile justice facilities in Pennsylvania. Young people report that these facilities are unsafe, unclean, and unable or unwilling to provide effective treatment or education, and that grievance procedures are not always fair. I am re-introducing this bill for this session, and I will not stop until we bring fairness to our Juvenile Justice Facilities.
