GOOD AFTERNOON. I AM NANCY DISCHINAT, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WORKFORCE BOARD LEHIGH VALLEY, SERVING LEHIGH AND NORTHAMPTON COUNTIES, ONE OF 23 WORKFORCE AREAS ACROSS PENNSYLVANIA.

THANK YOU CHAIR STURLA, HOST REPRESENTATIVE SCHWEYER, AND ALSO REPRESENTATIVES MIKE SCHLOSSBERG, JEANNE MCNEILL AND ROBERT FREEMAN ALL REPRESENTING THE LEHIGH VALLEY ON THIS COMMITTEE AND ALL MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE DEMOCRATIC POLICY COMMITTEE FOR HOSTING TODAY'S PUBLIC HEARING ON **CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION** AND FOR PROVIDING THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY ON BEHALF OF THE WORKFORCE BOARD AND ITS PA CAREERLINK LEHIGH VALLEY WORKFORCE SYSTEM.

IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT EMPLOYERS ARE OUR NUMBER ONE CUSTOMER ...BECAUSE WITHOUT THEM WE HAVE NO JOBS TO OFFER THE WORKFORCE.

GOOD JOB...IN INCREASING THE COMMONWEALTH'S BUDGET BY 10 MILLION DOLLARS IN SUPPORT OF CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION; OF WHICH 3 MILLION IS FOR EQUIPMENT GRANTS.

I THINK THE WORLD WAR 2 EQUIPMENT CAN BE RECYCLED FOR PARTS NOW?

WHEN REVIEWING THE **PLAN 4 PA** IT SPEAKS ABOUT PROVIDING TRAINING FOR JOBS IN A FAIR ECONOMY...WELL THIS CERTAINLY IS A FAIR ECONOMY...WE HAVE NOT HAD AN EMPLOYMENT RATE OF 96.4 PERCENT SINCE 1969! THERE IS A JOB FOR EVERYONE IN PA.

THE INCREASE IN THE EQUIPMENT GRANTS WILL PROVIDE MORE TRAINING ON INDUSTRY STANDARD EQUIPMENT. NOW, IF WE CAN JUST GET EMPLOYERS TO MATCH THAT 3 MILLION IN PA...THE TRAINING OF OUR TALENT PIPELINE WOULD BE MORE CLOSELY ALIGNED TO BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY STANDARDS.

SPEAKING ABOUT THE TALENT PIPELINE, THE PATHWAY TO A GOLD COLLAR JOB IN PA...WHICH IS A JOB REQUIRING ACADEMIC AND TECHNICAL SKILLS...IS THROUGH A CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATIONAL PATHWAY...WE ARE NOT KEEPING UP WITH THE WORKFORCE TALENT NEEDED IN OUR ECONOMY...EMPLOYERS ARE WAITING AT THE DOORS OF CAREER AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES BECAUSE WORKERS REQUIRE NOT ONLY LIFELONG LEARNING BUT

UPSKILLING...AND EMPLOYERS ARE PLAYING AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THIS ALSO...BECAUSE WE ARE SEEING THAT THE EMPLOYER IS BECOMING THE TRAINER OF CHOICE! WE ARE NOT PRODUCING ENOUGH TECHNICALLY TRAINED WORKERS TO MEET INDUSTRY NEEDS, SO EMPLOYERS ARE FAST TRACKING ON-SITE TRAINING PROGRAMS AND ACTUALLY BUILDING TRAINING FACILITIES...

THIS IS WHAT EMPLOYERS SAY TO US EVERY SINGLE DAY...

NANCY...WE NEED WORKERS WHO CAN MAKE DECISIONS, SOLVE PROBLEMS, CAN COMMUNICATE AND HAVE A GOOD WORK ATTITUDE. (GEE...YOU USED TO SAY A GOOD ATTITUDE...NOW YOU ADDED WORK ATTITUDE.)

NANCY...SOME OF OUR BEST ENGINEERS STARTED ON THE PRODUCTION FLOOR...WE NEED MORE STARTERS. (AND WE NEED YOUR HELP THROUGH INTERNSHIPS, APPRENTICESHIPS, MENTORING, JOB SHADOWING)

NANCY: WE SEE HIRING CAREER AND TECHNICAL GRADUATES AS A BUSINESS AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INVESTMENT. CORRECT! SO MAKE SURE YOU KNOW EXACTLY WHAT TRAINING IS TAKING PLACE AT OUR SCHOOLS. WHAT EQUIPMENT THEY ARE BEING TRAINED ON....AND WHAT INDUSTRY CAN DO TO NOT ONLY INCREASE THE OUTPUT OF TALENT BUT THE INPUT OF YOUTH SELECTING CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION AS THE PATHWAY TO A GOLD COLAR JOB...PUT UP A SIGN IN YOUR BUSINESS...WE HIRE CAREER AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL GRADUATES!!!!

NANCY...WE NEED MORE HANDS ON TRAINING, ON THE JOB TRAINING BECAUSE IT IS WHEN YOU ACTUALLY TURN THE WRENCH THAT TRAINING AND ACADEMICS COME TOGETHER. WE AGREE!

NANCY...WHAT ARE YOU DOING ABOUT THIS NEW "GHOSTING" TREND? WELL, WE HAVE OUR FIRST EMPLOYABILITY/IMPACT SKILLS CLASS, APPROVED IN THE ALLENTOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT AS A PROGRAM OF STUDY, AND TWO CLASSES ARE FILLED ALREADY WITH A WAITING LIST.

AND WITH ALL DUE RESPECT, WHEN PEOPLE ASK ME ABOUT GHOSTING, LACK OF EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS, ATTITUTES, AND THE **ALL ABOUT ME** SYNDROME THAT YOUTH EXHIBIT...I ALWAYS ASK THE QUESTION...I WONDER WHO RAISED THEM?

NANCY...WE HIRE WORK READY PEOPLE. WELL, HELP US GET THEM READY!

THE WORKFORCE BOARD CONTINUALLY TRACKS **BUSINESS HIRING** THROUGHOUT THE LEHIGH VALLEY AND THE RELATIONSHIPS WE HAVE BUILT WITH NEW AND EXPANDING COMPANIES CONFIRM THEY NEED A TECHNICALLY SKILLED WORKFORCE, ESPECIALLY THE PIPELINE OF STUDENTS COMPLETING CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION. FOR EXAMPLE:

ST. LUKE'S UNIVERSITY HEALTH NETWORK HAS SO MANY TECHNICALLY SKILLED WORKERS I CAN'T EVEN NAME THEM IN SEVEN MINUTES. SINCE HEALTHCARE REPRESENTS 19 PERCENT OF OUR WORKFORCE, WE OPENED A NEW CAREERLINK IN THEIR NEW ST. LUKE'S CAMPUS IN DOWNTOWN ALLENTOWN. WE ARE ALREADY PRODUCING A PIPELINE OF HEALTHCARE WORKERS THROUGH A YOUTH WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM AT THEIR MAIN HOSPITAL LOCATION, AND WE HAVE A CAREERLINK SATELLITE IN THE FOWLER COMMUNITY CENTER IN SOUTHSIDE BETHLEHEM...ALL NEEDING TECHNICALLY SKILLED HEALTHCARE WORKERS LIKE: HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY...TELEMEDICINE...NOT TO MENTION THE OTHER 50 TRADITIONAL HEALTHCARE OCCUPATIONS.

B. BRAUN'S PHARMACEUTICAL DIVISION HAS DEVELOPED THEIR OWN TRAINING PROGRAM TO GROW A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN WORKFORCE BY PARTNERING WITH THE WORKFORCE BOARD TO TRAIN AND ONBOARD THROUGH AN ON-THE-JOB TRAINING PROGRAM. AGAIN, THE NEWEST TRAINING VENDOR IS THE EMPLOYER...AND WE ARE SEEING MORE AND MORE OF THIS TREND.

B. BRAUN MEDICAL INC. CONTINUES TO GROW AND HIRE TECHNICALLY SKILLED WORKERS INCLUDING TECHNICIANS, PRODUCTION, ELECTROMECHANICAL, PLASTICS, TOOL AND DIE MOLD MAKERS, ENGINEERS AND MORE. CONSTRUCTION IS UNDERWAY TO EXPAND THEIR FACILITY FOR INCREASED MANUFACTURING CAPACITY, ADDING HUNDREDS OF JOBS BY 2021.

ADP, THE PAYROLL PROCESSING COMPANY, RELOCATING 700 EMPLOYEES TO ALLENTOWN. THEIR WORKFORCE IS ESTIMATED TO RISE TO 1,600, NEEDING WORKERS WITH NOT ONLY TECHNICAL SKILLS, BUT REQUIRING TOP-NOTCH EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS OF CUSTOMER SERVICE, CRITICAL THINKING, PROBLEM SOLVING, COMMUNICATIONS.

VICTAULIC, A MANUFACTURER OF MECHANICAL PIPE/FIRE SAFETY PRODUCTS, CONTINUES TO EXPAND...LAB TECHNICIANS, PROCESS ENGINEERS, PRODUCTION WORKERS, SUPERVISORS, AND MORE. THEY OFFER ON SITE TRAINING PROGRAMS BEFORE AND AFTER WORK HOURS...

FEDEX GROUND WORKED MONTHS AND MONTHS WITH THE WORKFORCE BOARD AND CAREERLINK TO RECRUIT AND HIRE ALMOST 1,500 WORKERS FOR THEIR NEW 850,000 SQUARE FOOT DISTRIBUTION CENTER NEAR THE AIRPORT THAT PROCESSES 45,000 PACKAGES EACH HOUR! THE NEW MEGA HUB HAS A MIXTURE OF WORKERS AND STATE-OF-THE-ART AUTOMATION TO GET THE JOB DONE, REQUIRING MATERIAL HANDLERS TO HAVE TECHNICAL SKILLS TO USE THE EQUIPMENT, TROUBLE SHOOT PROBLEMS, CRITICALLY THINK SOLUTIONS, AND CONTINUOUSLY IMPROVE PROCESSES...ALL AS 45,000 PACKAGES WHIZ BY!

DO YOU SEE A COMMON THEME HERE? NO MATTER WHAT THE INDUSTRY, COMPANIES NEED WORKERS WITH ACADEMIC AND TECHNICAL SKILLS...AND CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION DELIVERS!


