## ***Apply now for Property Tax/Rent Rebate***

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program Deadline has been extended to Dec. 31, 2020. Applications for a rebate on taxes or rent paid in 2019 are available at my district office or online at [www.revenue.pa.gov](http://www.revenue.pa.gov).

The program provides rebates up to \$650 on rent or property tax paid by Pennsylvanians 65 or older, widows and widowers 50 or older, and people with disabilities 18 or older. The income limit for applicants is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters. Half of Social Security income and all Social Security cost-of living increases are excluded

from income calculations.

Claimants must reapply for rebates every year because they are based on annual income and property taxes or rent paid each year. Spouses, personal representatives, or estates may file rebate applications on behalf of deceased claimants who lived at least one day in 2019.

My office can help complete and submit the application. The state has begun mailing refund checks to those who have already filed. Check the status of your rebate at [www.doreservices.state.pa.us/PITServices/WheresMyRebate](http://www.doreservices.state.pa.us/PITServices/WheresMyRebate).

## *Controlling the Spotted Lanternfly*

The spotted lanternfly is still active in the fall and winter. They lay egg masses which can survive over winter.

Look for these egg masses on tree trunks, outdoor furniture, decks, stones, metal, tires, etc. The masses are typically about 1 to 1.5 inches long and covered with a gray or yellowish-brown, waxy coating.

To destroy eggs, you should smash them or scrape them into a container of rubbing alcohol. You can also limit the number of adult insects by removing their preferred host trees, the tree of heaven. It is recommended that you apply herbicide to their stumps.

## *Home Heating Assistance Available*

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program is now accepting applications.

LIHEAP offers cash grants to help with home heating bills and crisis grants to help with emergency situations, such as a broken furnace or an unexpected fuel shortage. Applicants do not have to be on public assistance to receive help through LIHEAP, nor will any lien be placed on a person's property.

This season's income limits for LIHEAP cash and crisis grants are \$19,140 (yearly) for an individual. This limit increases by \$6,720 for each additional person in the household.

These grants are available to renters and homeowners. They range from \$200 to \$1,000 based on household size, income, and fuel type. These grants will be sent directly to your utility company or fuel provider. Grants do not need to be repaid. ## *PennDOT Resumes Issuing Real ID*

PennDOT has resumed issuing Real IDs to Pennsylvanians following a pause from March to September due to COVID-19. Real ID is a federally compliant driver's license or state photo identification card with enhanced security features.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has postponed enforcing the Real ID requirement until October 21, 2021. Then a Real ID or another federally accepted form of ID such as a U.S. Passport, will be necessary to board commercial flights or enter secure federal buildings.

To obtain a Real ID-compliant driver's license or ID card, you will need to bring all of the following documentation to a full-service Driver's License Center:

- Proof of identity (original birth certificate with a raised seal, or a valid U.S. passport)
- A Social Security card
- Proof of all legal name changes (marriage license or court order from applicable county's family court)
- Two proofs of current, physical PA Address (unexpired PA license or ID and no more than 90-day old bank statement or utility bill with the same name and address)

## ***New Resource for Relatives Raising Children***

---

If you are a grandparent, other relative, or non-relative, such as a teacher, coach, or family friend, raising a child when their biological parents cannot care for them, you should be aware of a resource launched in September by the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services called KinConnector. This is an information, referral, and education program for kinship

caregivers in Pennsylvania.

## ***PACE now Allowing Early Prescription Refills***

---

The Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract for the Elderly (PACE) is a prescription assistance program for adults aged 65 and older with limited incomes. PACENET provides the same prescription benefits for those with slightly higher incomes.

PACE and PACENET are now allowing for early prescription refills.

Previously, enrollees had to use 75% of their supply before refill costs would be reimbursed.

Now, the program will reimburse the cost of refills purchased before 75% of the days' supply has passed. (Does not apply to prescriptions for opioids and other controlled substances, which will be handled on a case-by-case basis.)

## ***Pa. Extends “Move Over” Law to Disabled Vehicles***

---

Pennsylvania has recently expanded its “Move Over” driving law. Previously, you were required to move to the far lane when passing police, emergency responders and utility employees stopped by the side of the highway. Now you must move over for disabled vehicles as well.

If you cannot do that safely, you must slow down to 20 m.p.h. below the posted limit. Penalties have also been increased. A first offense carries a fine of up to \$500 and 2 points on your driving record. Penalties for subsequent offenses increase considerably.

## ***COVID-19 Exposure Notification App Now Available***

---

The PA Department of Health has released its COVID-19 exposure notification app for iOS and Android smartphone users.

To download this app, visit your smartphone's app store and search COVID Alert PA. Once downloaded, you can opt-in to receive alerts to warn you of potential exposure to someone who tested positive for COVID-19. The more Pennsylvanians that use this app the more effective it will be.

COVID Alert PA protects your privacy and personal information. The app does not use GPS, location services, or any movement or geographical information. It will never collect, transmit, or store your personal information and is completely anonymous.

## ***New 3-Day Passes Now Available through SEPTA***

SEPTA's two new 3-day pass options for Transit and Regional Rail provide additional flexibility for riders.

The **Transit Convenience pass** costs \$18 and is valid for 24 SEPTA rides taken over 3 days on buses, trolleys, or subways (excludes regional rail).

The **Independence Regional Rail pass** costs \$36 and is good for 10 combined rides on buses, trolleys, subways, and regional rail.

3-day passes can be purchased on a SEPTA Key Card and are ideal for those who use Transit and Regional Rail less than five days a week. You can purchase these passes online at [www.septakey.org](http://www.septakey.org), through the SEPTA Key app, or in person at any SEPTA station fare kiosk or SEPTA sales office.

## ***New PA Health Insurance Marketplace***

If you do not have health insurance or need additional coverage Pennsylvania has a new health insurance marketplace for you.

"**Pennie**" is an online marketplace for affordable healthcare coverage. Pennie-certified Assistants can walk you through the shopping and enrollment process.

Healthcare coverage can only be purchased during the Open Enrollment period which began

November 1st and will continue until January 15th.

Pennsylvanians already enrolled through HealthCare.gov now will be transitioned to Pennie for their 2021 coverage.
