STANDING UP FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS IN THE MILITARY

Introduced with Reps. Jennifer O'Mara and Natalie Mihalek, a bipartisan resolution we are promoting would designate the week of April 18-24 as a time to acknowledge sexual assault survivors in the military. By highlighting this epidemic, we can begin a conversation at the state level to bring meaningful change and healing to those affected by military sexual trauma. We must honor the strength, resolve and perseverance of survivors and work urgently to end sexual violence in the military and all around the world. BURDEN OF PROOF FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS

Parents of students in special education programs face a number of challenges as their child moves through school. Advocating for more equitable education opportunities should NOT be added to that list. This bill, introduced with Rep. Tina Davis, places that burden of

proof on school districts – rather than the party seeking relief – in special education hearings. This is necessary because school districts are better able to meet that burden than parents or guardians of children with disabilities. Eleven other states have passed laws or

regulations changing the burden of proof to the school district. Let's have PA join those states in protecting the interests of children and families.

PROHIBITING DISCRIMINATION BASED ON MARITAL AND FAMILIAL STATUS
