WORKING HARD IN HARRISBURG

I work for the people of this community and this commonwealth, and a big part of that means legislating from the Capitol in Harrisburg. This term, I am serving on the following House committees: Appropriations, Health, Local Government and State Government. Here's a bit more about what I've been up to with my legislative efforts:

BALLOT QUESTION REFORM

I will soon be introducing a bill that proposes an amendment to our Election Code, ensuring the voices of more Pennsylvanians will be heard when it comes to constitutional changes that affect us all. My bill would require that ballot questions, like the ones a small percentage of us answered during the spring primary



ballot, be submitted to voters only during a general election and only every two years when there is a presidential or gubernatorial election. This will ensure that more voters have a say in amending our state constitution. Ideally, more voters would turn out to the polls for every election – because every election is important – but our history shows that this simply does not happen.

ESTABLISHING A 72-HOUR WAITING PERIOD FOR ALL FIREARM TRANSFERS

With Rep. Mike Zabel of Delaware County, I introduced a bill that would establish a 72-hour waiting period for all firearm transfers in the state of Pennsylvania. H.B. 1306 is the result of study after study supporting the fact that disrupting impulsive acts of violence and selfharm is established by instituting a waiting period. Lives are saved when more time is provided for individuals to gain perspective and seek necessary help. This bill was referred to the Judiciary Committee for further review.



PROHIBITION OF THE LGBTQ+ PANIC DEFENSE

Teaming with Rep. Mike Schlossberg of Lehigh County, we introduced a bill, H.B. 1582, that would prohibit the use of any LGBTQ+ panic defense in Pennsylvania, which is a defense theory that currently allows perpetrators of criminal actions against LGBTQ+ people to receive a lesser sentence – or even avoid conviction or punishment – by placing blame for their actions on a victim's actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. Use of this criminal justice loophole is a human rights violation and needs to be closed immediately. This bill was referred to the Judiciary Committee for further review.

HONORING TWO LOCAL HEROES

As an elected official, there are few moments more meaningful to me than being able to honor a hometown hero, which is exactly what we did on Independence Day weekend.





CAPT. SCHULTZ

In what was a long time in the making, as the COVID-19 pandemic had postponed the ceremony, we proudly gathered to rename the Edge Hill Road Bridge to the **Captain Samuel Schultz Memorial Bridge**.

The ceremony provided a beautiful tribute to Capt. Schultz, a U.S. Marine, Abington High School graduate and Huntingdon Valley native who was killed during a 2018 military training exercise. I was truly honored to share this moment with his parents, family and friends, as well as several of my colleagues.

Thank you to everyone who was involved, to those who helped make this dedication ceremony all that it

was. And, of course, my deepest appreciation to Capt. Schultz's family for being so patient and helpful as this day finally came to fruition.

Being able to host this dedication ceremony was a distinct privilege, and I will forever keep Capt. Schultz and his family in my thoughts. Please think of this young man's courage and sacrifice whenever you cross the newly named Captain Samuel Schultz Memorial Bridge.





On Sept. 15, 53 years after his death, I had the privilege and honor of leading the dedication ceremony of the **Corporal Vincent J. Wargo Jr., U.S.M.C. Memorial Highway**, a portion of Fitzwatertown Road that stretches from North Hills Avenue to Jenkintown Road.

Cpl. Wargo was a resident of Upper Dublin and a Bishop McDevitt High School graduate who enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps, served bravely during the Vietnam War and saved multiple injured comrades before succumbing to his own wounds in battle on Sept. 15, 1968, at the age of 19. He was posthumously awarded the Silver Star and Purple Heart medals.

I hope that every time we drive down this roadway, we take a moment to remember those in the Armed Forces who risk and sacrifice their lives to protect ours. Thank you, Cpl. Wargo, and thank you to your incredible family.
