

NEW DISTRICT INITIATIVES

Operation Safe Streets

One of the primary concerns I have for residents of the 192nd District is safety. 2021 was a record-breaking year for the city of Philadelphia regarding gun violence, and West Philadelphia saw its fair share. With this in mind, I am rolling out my strategic plan to combat gun violence and improve safety for our community. Through public-private partnerships, smart and timely investments, common-sense policy and legislation, as well as community engagement, I know we can make the District a safer place to live.

To kick off this initiative, I hosted a virtual “Meet the Funder” event, specifically for organizations working in the gun violence prevention space – connecting them to city and state grant opportunities. They received information on the Violence Intervention and Prevention Grant administered by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) and got a chance to ask questions directly to funding agencies and departments. I look forward to continuing this targeted work by identifying hot spots in the neighborhood, identifying areas to increase lighting and working with the local police district to bring resources back to the District to support community-focused efforts.

Beautify the 192nd

Philadelphia has a Litter Index which is operated by trained staff in the City departments responsible for surveying and documenting litter on city streets, sidewalks, vacant lots, and other public property. The index estimates a litter count across communities in Philadelphia ranging from (1) little to no litter, (2) litter in the amount that can be picked up by one person, (3) litter in the amount that would need a team to clean up, to (4) litter that would require a large cleanup effort and/or heavy machinery to remove debris.

The 192nd is no stranger to trash, overflowing dumpsters, short dumping, cluttered alleys and driveways. My team and I have heard from our neighbors, and we recognize that the overwhelming trash, litter, and pollution take away from the beauty of our streets, communities, and homes. We know it's time to put a plan of action in place.

My new initiative, Beautify the 192nd, supports improving the places where we live, work, and play so that they are places that are safe, clean, and accessible. By targeting “hot spots,” identified by the Philadelphia Litter Index and implementing best practices, we will work with community partners and residents to clean up the streets, remove the blight and maintain our homes for ourselves and generations to come. With the help of the PA Housing Finance Agency (PHFA), Overbrook West Neighbors and a group of local and minority-owned contractors, we have been able to make repairs and improvements on nearly 30 homes in the Overbrook community. I had the opportunity to meet some of the business owners and to see some of the projects up close.



Fall Resource Drive and Drop (Haddington, Wynnefield, Overbrook, Overbrook Park) November 20 and 22

I visited neighbors of the 192nd at their homes, Vine Memorial Baptist Church and Samuel Gompers School to distribute fall resources and deliver over 80 turkeys leading up to the Thanksgiving Holiday. Information on the Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) and community health resources were shared.

Back to School Protest at SLA Beeber August 30

I stood with students, parents, faculty, staff, and other elected officials to demand much needed attention on some of the school building conditions amidst the COVID-19 pandemic before sending our students back to in-person learning.



Gun Buy Back (Overbrook) October 9

I partnered with local stakeholders to host a Gun Buy Back at Holy Cross Baptist Church where community members could safely and anonymously dispose of firearms – no questions asked. These gun buybacks have collected more than 1000 guns in 2021 as part of a larger strategy to get guns off the streets and support safer communities.



Morris Park Tour November 23

I was able to meet with the Friends of Morris Park to identify strategic points for growth and commit to a renewed partnership, focused on continued upkeep, investment and expansion of this public space in our community.



Overbrook Park Vaccine Clinic | December 10

I was invited to join Penn Medicine, McDonald's Franchisee Tonya Holliday, Councilmember Curtis Jones Jr., and Senator Vincent Hughes as community members came out in preparation for the holiday season to get vaccinated to help keep themselves and their families safe and healthy. Over 90 residents were able to get vaccinated and boosted, and my team and I provided state resources to over 100 people on site.


